The prologue discusses most of what has been written about the water topic and analysis it critically, specially what has been written in Palestine and the neighboring countries like Syria. Lebanon, Iraq. and other countries like Spain, India, and Pakistan.

In the first chapter, "A Geographical Introduction for the Study Area". The researcher discusses the geographical features and the climate of the area study emphasizing on the specific chosen areas, specially Fari, a valley and Jericho areas.
